

Senior Fellowship Pathway (June-December 2022)

What is the Senior Fellowship Pathway?

The Senior Fellowship Pathway supports staff to gain Senior Fellowship of the Higher Education Academy. Senior Fellowship is a recognition of the positive impact of experienced staff on student learning, both by directly influencing students themselves, and by influencing their colleagues. Senior Fellowship is awarded by [Advance HE](#).

What are the benefits of participating in the Pathway?

Applying for Senior Fellowship of the HEA is an opportunity to take time out to reflect on your practice and the impact of your work. It is also a chance to identify your hopes and priorities for the next stage of your career in learning and teaching.

What is the Pathway for?

The Senior Fellowship Pathway is designed to give you space, guidance and peer support to create your application, which consists of i) a reflection on your roles, responsibilities and professional experience, and ii) two case studies (6000 words in total).

Who is the Pathway for?

Senior Fellowship is suitable for those who have a few years of experience of teaching and/or supporting learning, and can talk about how they have influenced colleagues as well as students. It is not only academic staff who are eligible: anyone who has a role in supporting student learning is able to apply, e.g. learning technologists. The Pathway supports colleagues on all Heriot-Watt campuses.

What does participation in the Pathway involve?

The Pathway runs for 7 months, from June to December 2022, and is designed to take you all the way from your first look at the SFHEA application form, to submitting your completed application.

- There will be fortnightly live sessions, held on Teams, where you will receive advice and guidance, and work with peers on aspects of your application
 - The initial session of the Pathway will be on **Tuesday 28 June**, 9-10am UK / 12-1pm Dubai / 4-5pm Malaysia
 - Regular fortnightly sessions will then begin in August
- You will be provided with a mentor who has successfully gained their Senior Fellowship, to provide support throughout the Pathway
- You will be provided with feedback as you draft your application
- Heriot-Watt will pay for your application to Advance HE

The intention is for participants to submit their applications at the end of the 7-month Pathway. The total time commitment will depend on the individual, but a rough guide would be 40-60 hours (including attendance at Pathway sessions).
